CREATIVITY STARTS HERE!

The theme of this year's inaugural Satisfied Eye International Film Festival (SEIFF) is Women in Film, inspired by the centenary of women voting rights. To celebrate, we are running a competition for school children (aged 4-16) to create a piece of work based around a female hero. The hero can be a historical figure, an existing fictional character or children can create a completely new fictional character. The only restriction is that the hero cannot be someone they know personally!

THE COMPETITION

There are 5 categories: Reception, Key Stage 1, Key Stage 2, Key Stage 3 and Key Stage 4. Children can interpret the female hero in any way they like. It could be a policewoman, an inventor, a superhero, an animal, even a female dragon! There are no limits to their imagination.

Reception: Pupils can submit a piece of art (it can be a drawing, painting or collage using any creative tools they like) the only restriction is that it must fit on a single sheet of A4.

Key Stages 1-4: Pupils can submit either a piece of art or a cartoon (same rules as above); a short story (maximum 300 words); or a short film or animation (no more than 60 seconds).

WINNERS

Winning entries in each category will be displayed at the festival and winners will receive specially-commissioned trophies and a selection of exciting prizes, presented by celebrity guests at the festival's closing awards ceremony at the Queen's Stand, Epsom Racecourse.

Prizes will be awarded by a panel of esteemed industry experts which includes Oscar, BAFTA and Emmy winners with credits ranging from Interstellar to Star Wars.

THE FESTIVAL

SEIFF is an exciting new event and an unforgettable experience for all ages, with film-related activities taking place throughout Epsom & Ewell. An essential fixture in the calendar of those working at all levels of the film industry, it's also intended as an exciting new community event.

Presenting a diverse programme of only the highest quality independent feature films, animation, documentaries and shorts from around the world, SEIFF opens a unique window on global film.

Mixing community events, workshops, mentoring, a few famous faces and closing with a gala red-carpet awards ceremony, SEIFF will be a truly celebratory, inclusive and inspiring occasion to remember.

SEIFF has already had submissions from over 30 countries including Iran, Korea, China, Brazil, Poland, Australia and the US and will bring the very best new talents from around the world.

OFFICIAL SUBMISSION FORM

RULES

By entering the competition, schools and entrants confirm that they have read, understood, and agree to be bound by the following competition rules.

1. The competition is open to all schools in Surrey and
2. The competition is open to all pupils aged 4-16.
3. Entry must be made through the school.
4. Entries submitted directly by pupils will not be accepted.
5. Only one entry to the competition per pupil.
6. Class submissions ARE eligible. In this instance, the name of the class and not the name of the child should be included on the work provided.
7. Children entered as part of a class submission CANNOT be entered individually in addition.
8. Entries must be received no later than midnight on Monday 10 September 2018.
10. Receipt of entries is PREFERRED by the close of the July Summer term 2018, but will be accepted until the final closing date of midnight on Monday 10 September 2018 (allowing for schools which might wish to set this as a summer holiday project).
11. Winners will be notified by 4pm on 24 September 2018 and results will be posted on the SEIFF website www.seiff.shp.media from this date.
12. Schools are responsible for informing winning pupils.
13. The winner of the competition shall be decided by a panel of judges (consisting of representatives from SEIFF) and who shall decide, in their absolute discretion, the winner.
14. The decision of the judges shall be final and binding and no correspondence shall be entered into by SEIFF.
15. The copyright in any image entered in the competition shall remain with the entrant. However, entrants consent to SEIFF using any of the winning images for any publicity and/or promotional activities. Winners consent to their name and winning work being posted in SEIFF venues and on the SEIFF website.
16. The competition prizes for all categories shall consist of a specially designed trophy, prizes and invitation to the festival's closing ceremony where winners will be presented with the award.
17. If winners are unable to attend the ceremony, SEIFF will ensure delivery of trophy and prizes to the school.
18. Winning artworks will be displayed at SEIFF venues during the festival. Works can be returned on request once the festival closes.
19. No cash alternative to any prize is available and the prizes shall be non-transferable.
20. SEIFF takes no responsibility for work not including return postage and not collected by 28 October.

HOW TO SUBMIT

1. Entries must be delivered by post to Lorna Doyle, Festival Co-Ordinator, SEIFF, 34 Pine Hill, Epsom, Surrey KT18 7BG.
2. An email acknowledgement will be sent to the named contact to confirm receipt.
3. Only entries attaching/enclosing the official submission form will be accepted.
4. Work sent by post can be returned upon request but must be CLEARLY MARKED as such on the submission form.
5. Alternatively schools may collect the work at the closing ceremony on 28 October.
6. Work will not be returned unless the correct postage has been enclosed.
7. Images and/or media files sent electronically must be in jpg format and media files in Quicktime or MPV formats.
8. Each individual postal entry must have the following submission information marked clearly on the back, otherwise it will not be considered: Pupil's Name, Class Name, Category (eg KS2) and School Name.
9. If it's a class entry please write clearly 'Class Entry' instead of child's name.
10. Postal submissions which include electronic entries should be provided on a disc or USB in a separate envelope contained within your package and with a label inside the same envelope providing the required submission information.
11. Schools may like to use the label (below) to attach to the reverse of each or can write directly onto the reverse of the submission with the same information.
12. Make absolutely sure that the name of each child is written clearly and spelt correctly as no amendments will be made at a later stage.
13. There is no limit to the entries any school can send.
14. It is up to the individual school to decide whether to send ALL submissions or to choose the best in each category before submission.
15. SEIFF are not responsible for late, lost or delayed entries.

Entry to the competition shall only be valid if the entrant has complied with these competition rules.
